- 1. Amadeus Purchase Order 24-240 (\$17,141) adding integrated Baggage Information Control System hardware
- 2. Recommend approval of a one-year Service Support Agreement with Designa Access Corporation for an amount not to exceed sixty-nine thousand three hundred sixty dollars (\$69,360.00). Agreement has option to extend for an additional year at the same rate (\$69,360 for year 2). This agreement covers the maintenance of all parking equipment at the airport.
- 3. Recommend approval of amendment to the airfield painting contract with Remac Inc from \$400,000 (approved by the Authority on September 6, 2023) to \$404,000. The increase is due to a small increase in the scope of work necessary to stay in compliance with regulations.

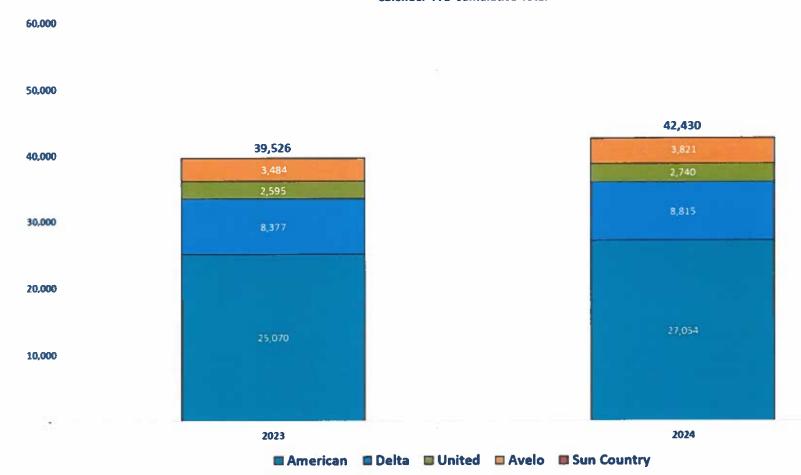

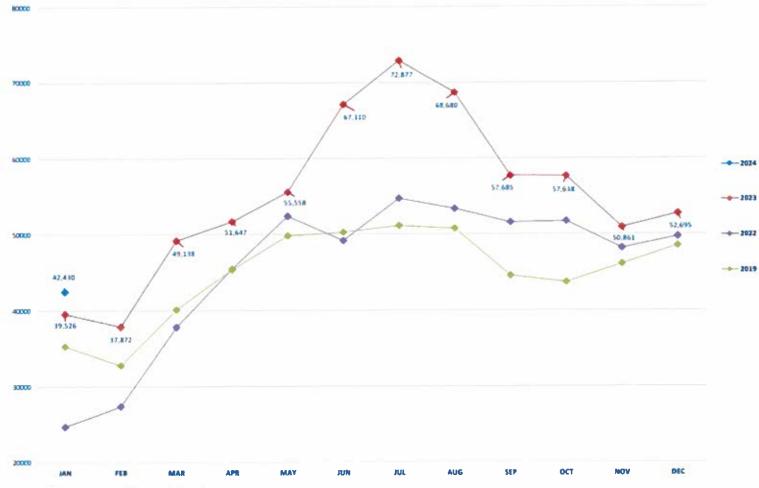
ENPLANED PASSENGERS BY AIRLINE JANUARY

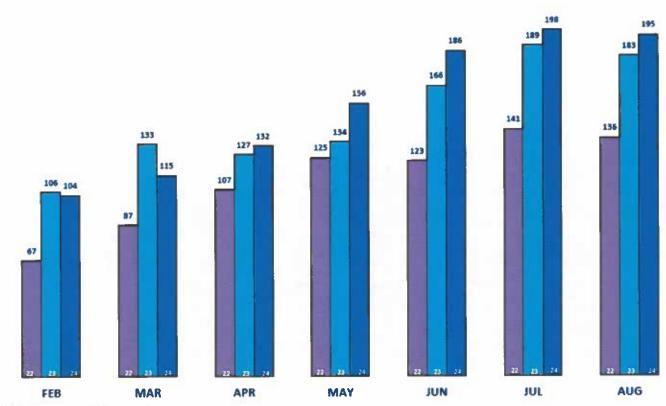
SEAT CAPACITY February-August

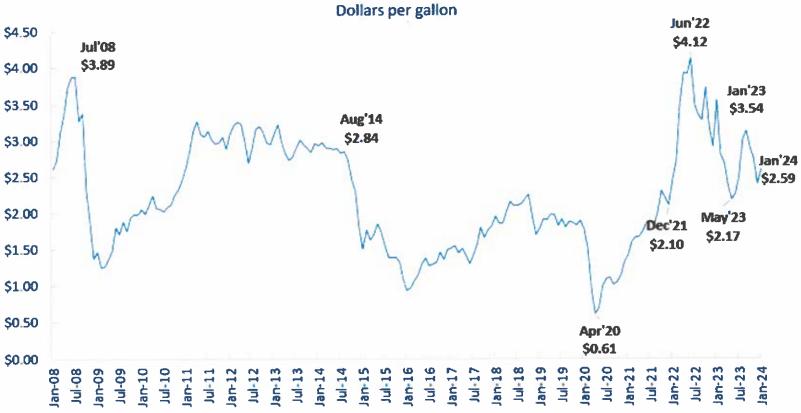

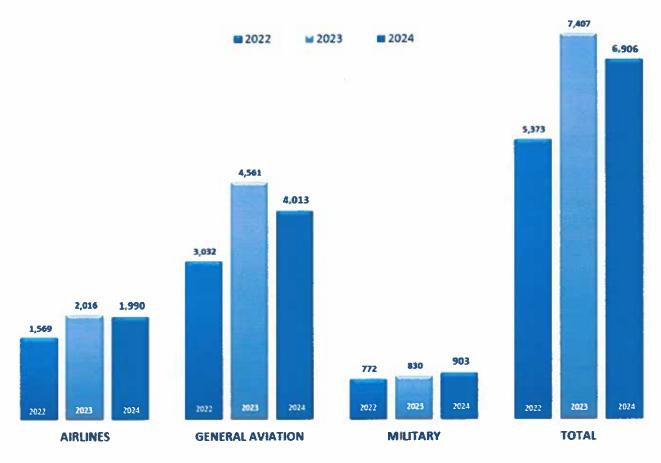

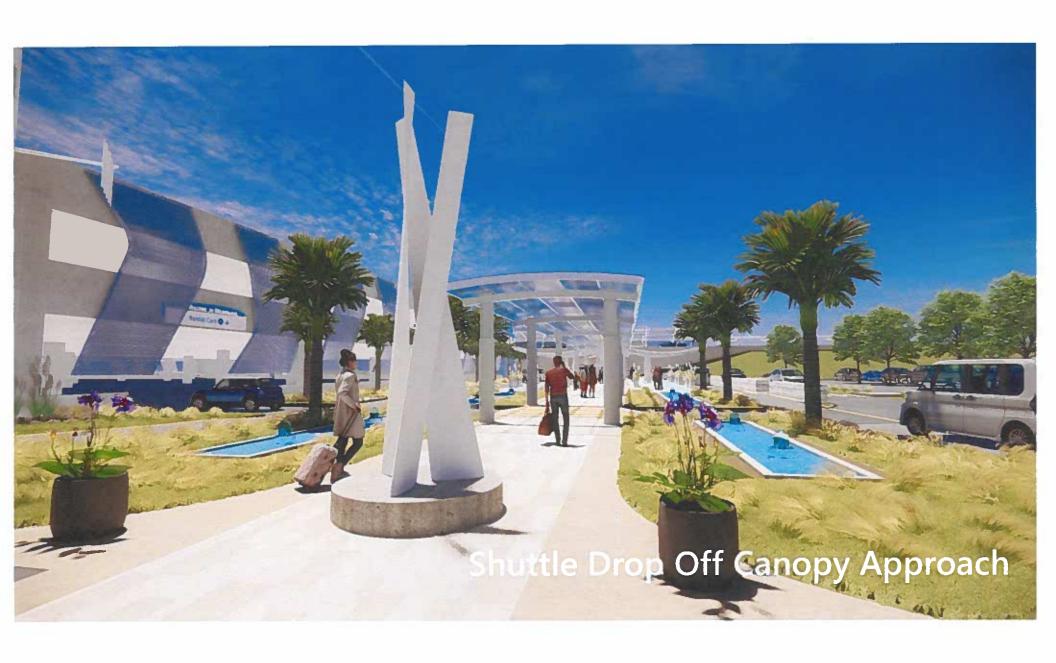

ORGANIZATION

Ongoing Board of Directors

Composition of the ongoing Board. The ongoing Board shall consist of seven (7) members, all of which shall be appointed by the New Hanover County Airport Authority as follows:

One (1) New Hanover County Airport Authority Member or designee

Six (6) At large members appointed by the New Hanover County Airport Authority

Honorary Directors. In recognition of significant service to the Foundation or contributions of other nature, the Board of Directors may also appoint honorary or emeritus directors. Such directors shall be considered ex-officio members of the Board but shall not have the power to vote at Board meetings.



STAFFING AND ORGANIZATIONAL SUPPORT

Initial support for the organization will come from airport employees volunteering their time to support this important effort. Supporting ILM staff includes:

- Jeff Bourk, A.A.E., MBA, ILM Airport Director (licensed pilot & 30 years experience managing airports and running FBO's)
- Michele Bourk (licensed pilot and flight instructor)
- Robert Campbell, AAE, CPA, ILM Deputy Director and Accountant
- Granseur Dick, P.E., A.A.E., Deputy Director (licensed pilot)
- Rose Davis, Executive Assistant

ILM will donate office space, a link to the website and a phone number for the organization to get started. The Airport Authority is also supportive of the creation of this non-profit and will receive an annual report from the foundation and appoint one board member.

Once \$150,000 is received one part time executive director will be hired to assist with running the non-profit.



SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

We plan to put flight simulators in every school in the county and establish an afterschool program educating kids about flying and flying as a career choice. Volunteer flight instructors will assist with the afterschool program.





SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Pilot Training Scholarships. Selection will be recommended by the schools and an application process will be based on other similar programs around the country.

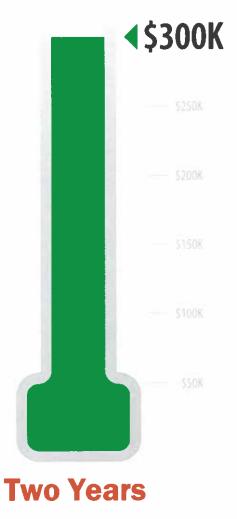
